The archive offices have recently moved to 2227 South Millway, Suite 200 in Mississauga, Ontario. The move allowed for the reconfiguration of the archive's storage room along with the addition of new shelving and drawers thanks in part to the Museum Assistance Program, Collection Management Grant by the Department of Canadian Heritage. Our head archivist Stephanie was thrilled to be able to start from scratch and organize the archive to allow for greater visitor access to our over 125,000 negatives, slides, prints and ephemera.

We are also excited to share our latest digitized images. Thanks to funding in part, by the Province of Manitoba's Heritage Grants Program, the CHPF archiving team were able to digitize over 1200 images of Manitoba photographed by renowned photographer George Hunter - taken from the very beginning of his long photographic career. Finally, our archivist and team of students and interns are hard at work completing our latest project funded by the Documentary Heritage Communities Program. Digitizing and Preserving Historic Images of Canada: CHPF's 20th Anniversary Photographic Retrospective of Founding Members is a digitization and preservation project including works by some of the CHPF founding photographers including George Hunter, Eric Hayes, Lou Perrin, James Wilson, Tom Bochsler and others. CHPF is proud to receive a collection of approximately 25,000 images from rock and roll and fine art photographer Eric Hayes. Eric was a founding member of the Foundation in 2001. His career spanning over sixty years includes iconic Canadian images as a photo-journalist for magazines including Maclean's, Canadian Living, Equinox and more. Eric also photographed renowned music legends like The Who, Janis Joplin, Jimi Hendrix, Bob Dylan, John Lennon and the Rolling Stones.

In the early 2000s, Eric parlayed his career into the art forum and was a founding member of ViewPoint Gallery in Halifax. Today, Eric is working on digitizing his expansive collection. His donation to CHPF includes his magazine work from the 1980's and 90's. We look forward to sharing more of Eric's work in the upcoming CHPF Founding Members Retrospective.
